

Afghanistan: ISIS kills three female media workers

From [Afghan officials had initially accused the Taliban](#) of killing the women in two separate attacks this week. Disputing that, ISIS later claimed responsibility for the attack and revealed the women had been killed for working for media stations associated with the Afghan government.

One colleague, who asked to remain anonymous said: "Three innocent girls were shot dead in the daylight in the middle of the city. Nobody is safe anymore."

While talking to AFP, Zalmai Latifi, director at the TV station, said four female media workers were attacked in two separate incidents after they left the office. He said, "They are all dead. They were going home from the office on foot when they were shot."
