At least 60 civilians and 12 US forces die in suicide bombings • Pressure mounts on Biden after Isis

At least 12 US troops were killed along with an unknown number of Afghans when two suicide bombers attacked crowds outside the airport, according to a report from the scene showed dozens of bodies and wounded civilians every day along the airport with a sewage pipe was followed by gunfire.

The Pentagon blamed the blasts on ISIS-K, Afghanistan's Islamic State branch, and came hours after the United States, Britain and other allies warned of an imminent threat of an attack and urged their citizens to stay away from the airport area. The group claimed responsibility last night for the attack in a video posted by its Arabic news agency.

It represents the heaviest loss of US service lives since a military helicopter was shot down in eastern Afghanistan, a killing of special operation troops, a decade ago. The bombings will raise further pressure on President Biden, who was already facing international criticism for refusing to extend his self-imposed deadline of August 31 to complete the US withdrawal from Afghanistan after two decades of war.

It was this deadline — chosen to ensure that the US was out before the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks — that drew crowds to the airport despite the risks that Biden himself said on Tuesday were "acute and growing."

The president was in discussions with his security advisers at the White House as he planned to send a national address. He has been strongly condemned by Republicans and some members of his own party for his handling of the withdrawal.

Carnage in Kabul: dozens killed in airport bombing



I know: Strategy is everything. Without weighing all the consequences, without planning a long range game, we end up in Kabul as it is today, on 8/26/21. And yet: ISIS-K is also fighting with the Taliban. I say: Get 'em both. This cannot stand. They have just killed the bravest of our soldiers who

This cannot stand.
