## Anatomy of the terror threat: Files show hundreds of US plots, refugee connection

Judson Berger writes at <u>Human Rights Watch</u> said nearly half of the federal counterterror convictions at the time came from "informant-based cases," many of them sting operations where the informants played a role in the plot.

The report said: "In some cases the Federal Bureau of Investigation may have created terrorists out of lawabiding individuals by conducting sting operations that facilitated or invented the target's willingness to act."

But even in some of those cases, federal agents got involved after learning of a serious suspected plot. In the case of the Seattle suspect, Abu Khalid Abdul-Latif, authorities said he approached someone in 2011 about attacking a military installation. That citizen alerted law enforcement and worked with them to capture Latif and an accomplice.
