This month is the 71st anniversary (August 13th) of the death of H.G. Wells, author of The War of the Worlds. It's also the 60th anniversary (24th) of the death of Ronald Arbuthnott Knox (Who the hell is he? I hear you ask). Knox, an English clergyman and writer, had his claim to fame in a much-forgotten BBC radio hoax in 1926. The broadcast, which predated Wells's more famous 1938 alien war hoax, was a simulated
