One Nation? Under God? Indivisible? With Liberty and Justice for All?

I recited the pledge of allegiance every school day in Elementary and Junior High School. The pledge was written by Francis Bellamy in 1892, and formally adopted by Congress as the national pledge in 1942. Today, all of the descriptive terms describing the kind of republic that the flag stands for are not only under assault, they seem absolutely proscribed. For the past half century, this attack on these once hallowed words has been a matter of Democrat Party policy.
