
# The Secret that was No Secret

A Question of Command (Felipe Jesus Consalvos, 20th C)

We know they are lying, they know they are lying, they know we know they are lying, we know they know we know they are lying, but they are still lying. —Solzhenitsyn

Original Sin, the book authored by a component of the media hivemind, sparked a firestorm three months ago inside the hivemind itself over the revelation of the "secret" that was no secret. Had the book been written by a libertarian or a conservative instead of a liberal, the contents would have been automatically labeled as "far right disinformation" and thoughtlessly <u>ignored</u>. As it is, liberals proclaimed how shocked-yes, shocked! -they were at learning the news, especially by the media hivemind ("Gee, I didn't know!"), and this in turn led to a torrent of scorn in TikTok being poured on liberal journalists. Some have even written that when his senility was pointed out in the very beginning by conservatives and libertarians, that was labeled right wing disinformation, while those who took part in the coverup are now pointing the finger at other journalists. Even Jill Biden's press secretary is turning against the Bidens in selfrighteous indignation-now that it is safe fashionable. Karine Jean-Pierre, the White <u>House</u> press secretary likewise announced she is leaving the Democrat Party and will soon publish a book revealing how dysfunctional was the administration—the same entity she lied for to the public.

Nevertheless, even now some liberal journalists are <u>either</u> denying that the <u>media</u> covered up <u>Biden's</u> dementia or that the old man is <u>senile</u>, including Democratic <u>politicians</u>. Their willful blindness, based on fanaticism is <u>astounding</u>.

At the National <u>Education</u> Association annual conference, he introduced himself as "I'm Joe Biden's Husband, Joe Biden."

At a campaign stop in Texas, Biden forgot the well-known words to the Declaration of Independence that every schoolchild knows.

Biden claimed to have been arrested during the apartheid era when he tried to meet with <u>Nelson</u> Mandela. Years later, he said the same, so perhaps this time it was just a lie rather than dementia.

At a campaign event with <u>Kamala</u> Harris, he declared that America had 54 states; then he almost fell off the stage while she, fretting, tried to hold him steadily without appearing to do so.

In 2020, progressive commentator and loudmouth <u>Cenk</u> Uygur pointed out the obvious, namely that Biden was showing signs of dementia. *In 2020!* Later, Democrats and the media hivemind would insist the 2020 election was not subject to fraud.

### 2021

At the  $\underline{G20}$  summit, Biden blurted out he was given a list of the only reporters he was allowed to call on.

His <u>speech</u> on the <u>anniversary</u> of 9/11 was an example of rambling incoherence.

In regards to the 2018 massacre in The Tree of Life Synagogue, he claimed to have visited it after the tragedy. Not true.

Biden was being given orders by the Pulitburo, but he would sometimes go off script, sometimes simply by revealing the orders he had been given. While being interviewed on  $\underline{\mathsf{CNN}}$ , Biden forgot what city he was in.

<u>Biden</u> just said that he was a liaison during the Six Day War in Israel, which was not true.

At the <u>Christmas</u> tree lighting ceremony, he was introduced to the crowd, but failed to come out. Somebody had to remind him to do so.

In a speech at the <u>White House</u> regarding Juneteenth, <u>Biden</u> was incoherent at times.

One time when Biden was starting to become <u>incoherent</u>, his handlers cut Biden's feed. When Republicans pointed it out, the media hivemind became indignant with them.

# 2022

Joe Biden claimed he had <u>been arrested</u> marching in the civil rights movement. Not true.

When a component of the media <a href="hivemind">hivemind</a> asked Joe Biden whether he would end Trump's Title 42 regarding the expulsion of illegal aliens, Biden started rambling about mandating face masks on airplanes.

In a celebration of appointing an <u>idiot</u> to the US Supreme <u>Court</u>, Biden mentioned Biden he "was in the foothills of the Himalayas with Xi Jinping, traveling with him [backpacking?]. "That's when I traveled 17,000 miles when I was Vice President. I don't know that for a fact."

Here is a partial compilation of his senile gaffes while speaking <u>in Congress</u>.

In a speech, he forgot <u>Thomas Edison's</u> name. He also could not recall the <u>name</u> of his Secretary of Commerce. Or his Secretary

He reminded black voters in <u>Atlanta</u> that George Wallace praised him, which he reciprocated.

<u>Biden</u> stated he was paid a million dollars while he <u>taught</u> at the University of Pennsylvania. Was it perhaps in the Communications Department? No matter. He never did.

He referred to <u>Kamala</u> Harris as the First Lady, which must not have pleased Jill Biden.

Biden was photographed holding a cheat sheet while he spoke, but what was more important is what he said at the end of his speech in the <a href="White">White</a> House: "I'll take your questions, and as usual, folks, they gave me a list of the people I'm going to call on." You can bet they submitted the questions in advance. Which proves that the WH press corps knew in what condition he was in and they were just propaganda peddlers.

At a graduation for midshipmen, <u>Biden</u> wrongly stated he had gone to Iraq and Afghanistan 40 times.

Biden had the habit of reading a <u>speech</u> and of also reading out loud the orders he was supposed to do. In front of "journalists."

It is hard to say whether it was his senility or just echoing the official Party line when he stated that police officers were <u>killed</u> during the January six "insurrection."

On at <u>least</u> one occasion, Biden referred to Kamala Harris as the President.

In the <u>State</u> of the Union, he referred to Ukrainians as the Iranian people.

After the Consumer Prices jumped 8.5% over the previous 12 months, Biden stated that Americans experienced 0% inflation.

A camera caught Biden's written <u>orders</u> from his handlers on what to do and say, such as "enter the Roosevelt Room and say hello to participants." And "YOU take YOUR seat." And "YOU thank participants" and "YOU depart." Biden would occasionally grumble about his handlers not letting him do things.

One time when Biden screwed up <u>a speech</u>, the White House staff altered the transcript of what he said.

He mentioned in a <u>speech</u> that the American people had received an \$8,000 stimulus <u>check</u> because of Covid. I never got mine.

Biden claimed that he gave his uncle a Purple <u>Heart</u> because of his actions at the Battle of the Bulge. Nope.

Seconds after Biden shaking <u>hands</u> with his fellow leftist, Chuck Schumer, he wanted to shake hands again.

At the US Naval Academy's <u>Class</u> of 2022 graduation, Biden claimed he had been appointed to the Naval Academy. And <u>screamed</u> at his captive audience.

After giving a speech, Biden wandered around the <a href="stage">stage</a>, unsure what to do.

More mumbling from <u>Joe</u> Biden. Between his mumbling and Kamala's word salad perhaps they should have created a school of oratory.

He declared he was raised in the <u>Puerto</u> Rican community. Then he went to <u>Puerto</u> Rico and spoke gibberish.

In talking about gun control, Biden pointed out that his legislation would outlaw 8 bullets in a round.

In speaking at a black university, Biden said that he got his start at a black university. Elsewhere, he claimed that he invented insulin, which is some trick since insulin is produced in the body. And, again elsewhere, instead of beginning a speech with "Ladies and Gentlemen," he began "Gays and Gentlemen." That may not have gone over too well.

And even though he signed an executive order to eliminate student loan debt, he said that Congress <u>passed</u> the law.

When Biden wrongly stated that <u>gasoline</u> was at \$5, that may have been an honest mistake, though the words "honest" and "Biden" just don't go together. They repel each other.

At a White House event full of "journalists," Biden introduced Rep. Jackie Walorski of Indiana and asked for her in the <a href="mailto:crowd">crowd</a>. She was not there. She was in the cemetery. Perhaps if he had had the help of Hillary in drawing a pentagram, Walorski might have made an appearance after all.

In Indonesia, he was given a list of instructions (<u>orders</u>) on what to do and say, with the written orders perfectly visible.

At this point, it would be good to remember that during the first year of Trump's <u>first</u> administration, the <u>media</u> clamored 600 times that he be removed under the <u>25<sup>th</sup></u> Amendment for

# 2023

During a visit with India's prime minister, Biden <u>admitted</u> having sold a lot of state secrets. That may not have been a lie or a gaffe, but an unintentional admission.

In a meeting with Putin, Biden got <u>mixed up</u> on some things.

It was <u>revealed</u> that at <u>least</u> one "journalist" submitted the question to the Biden staff prior to the <u>press</u> conference.

In a ceremony, Biden sang Happy Birthday to Martin Luther King III's wife—then forgot her name.

When asked about running for a second term by a "journalist," Joe Biden's mind went <a href="blank">blank</a>.

At a campaign stop in Manhattan, <u>Biden</u> repeated himself <u>word</u> for <u>word</u>, a common symptom of dementia. He also forgot to <u>shake</u> hands with the president of Brazil and collided with a <u>flag</u> post.

An <u>ESPN</u> host was shocked at Biden's incoherence but said nothing about it as a story, just mentioned it to someone else. Considering she worked at ESPN, she would almost certainly have lost her job if she had done so. Before the interview, every <u>word</u>, every question, was gone over again and again as if she was the one with dementia.

He forgot to sign an <u>executive order</u> after he said he was going to, which really did not matter since someone from the Politburo had been signing for him all the time.

At the <u>Irish</u> Parliament, Biden read his speech from the teleprompter, including the end, "End of quote."

# 2024

In <a href="Philadelphia">Philadelphia</a>, as President, he announced his candidacy for ... Congress.

In <u>Brazil</u> for the G20 meeting, all the world leaders posed for a photograph, but Joe Biden wandered off somewhere.

Whereas previously, he had called upon somebody who was <u>dead</u>, on another time Biden referred to someone who was alive as being dead.

One of Joe Biden's abilities, besides his gift for corruption, bribery, and being a superb ventriloquist dummy, is his gift of being able to talk to dead people—prominent dead people at that—even without the use of a Ouija board.
