
How I got canceled

The day after Israel won its 1967 war of self-defense, the propaganda began in deadly earnest against both Israel and the West. Academics, including feminists (my people), became more obsessed with the alleged occupation of Palestine, a country that had never existed, than with real genocides or the occupation of women's bodies.
