Sen. John McCain on Wednesday directly accused fellow Republican Sen. Rand Paul of working for Russian President Vladimir Putin. While speaking from the Senate floor in support of a bill advancing Montenegro's bid to join NATO, McCain noted objection from the Kentucky senator, saying, "You are achieving the objectives of Vladimir Putin... trying to dismember this small country which has already been the subject an attempted coup." He then directly connected Paul to the Russians: "The only

conclusion you can draw when he walks away is he has no justification for his objection to having a small nation be part of NATO that is under assault from the Russians. So I repeat again, the senator from Kentucky is now working for Vladimir Putin.”
