"According to the principle of judicial independence, it would be improper for us to comment on this trial before its end, though certainly we will continue to observe the situation closely."

"As to Mr Robinson's political views, we believe political pluralism is one of the most important issues in modern society. The oppression of citizens due to their opinions is not acceptable in any state, including the United Kingdom."

Tommy is to be sentenced at the Central Criminal Court Old Bailey tomorrow.
