The road to totalitarianism is paved with Democrat lies

The witnesses, victims of District Attorney Alvin Bragg's coddling of criminals, apparently were serving "as props in the MAGA Broadway production."

They say not a peep when Black Lives Matter and Antifa riot and destroy cities, and their local partners refuse to apply the law in those instances.
