A former West Midlands Police officer has been found guilty of sexually assaulting a 13-year-old girl he met online. Haider Siddique, 22, was found guilty of sexual activity with a child, inciting a child to commit a sexual act, child abduction and grooming.

In March last year, a bus driver spotted Siddique acting inappropriately towards the 13-year-old girl while he was on long-term sick leave. The witness reported the incident to police who later identified Siddique.

Siddique was taken into police custody where he resigned from his post. The 22-year-old joined the force in August 2021, but had been off sick since November that year and was never deployed to an operational role.

Siddique has now been remanded. He is due for sentencing in March. . . After the criminal court case has concluded, the force will convene a 'former officer' misconduct hearing.

Deputy Chief Constable Vanessa Jardine, from West Midlands Police, said: "This was a sickening criminal act by a former student officer, who appeared to be offering support to this vulnerable young girl but was in fact grooming her sexually. .
